CREMATION POLICY

In recent years the Church has permitted the cremation of our mortal remains. There are certain conditions connected to this new custom for which you must be aware. The most important is that before we can agree to having the Funeral Mass, we must be assured that the CREMAINS will be properly interred in the ground or mausoleum. It is important that the remains be kept intact as a sign of our belief in the Resurrection of the body. This means that the ashes cannot be kept at home or in another's possession; nor can they be scattered or divided up among relatives and friends. Please be aware of these criteria before planning your funeral or that of a loved one.
