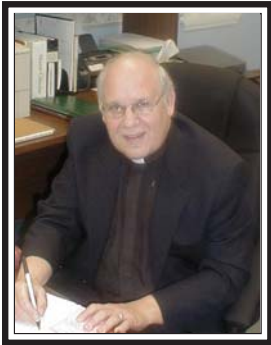

SIGNS OF THE TIMES

Jesus was fond of using images from nature to teach us about the Kingdom of God. He used images of sheep and shepherds, trees

and storms. But perhaps the most popular one was the image of the seed planted in various kinds of soil. This image helps us understand how the Kingdom of God grows. It grows slowly, mysteriously, almost imperceptibly. Yet it grows.

I kept an eye on some seeds I had planted back in March, probably too early given the icy wet March we experienced. But, low and behold, the other day I noticed some of them had begun to sprout. Yes, some were destroyed by the bad weather (my need to plant early) but some grew without my knowledge. Some mysterious force was at work fostering and encouraging those seeds to grow.

The parish is a sign of the Kingdom, and so it follows the same laws as do seeds. In the beginning, growth can be almost imperceptible; yet without us, and in some cases in spite of us, God fertilizes and waters our feeble efforts and makes them grow.

Perhaps I am being overly optimistic, but I think I have detected signs of parish growth recently. Just last Sunday I baptized five (5) children. (That is a lot for us these days.) In addition, over the last few months we have had several new families join the parish, almost all of whom have already volunteered to help the parish in some way: a new usher, a new extraordinary minister of holy communion and several new festival workers. To all of you a heartfelt thank you and much appreciation.

Former parishioners are stepping forward as well: for example, new money-counters, carpenters and painters. Finally, the parish itself responded so generously to last fall's Increased Offertory Campaign that I am happy to announce that we will enjoy **a balanced budget in the next fiscal year (July 1, 2007 – June 30, 2008)**. These are signs that this little corner of the Kingdom called Resurrection Parish is beginning a new period of growth and for that end I am most grateful.

Turning a page of history also takes much planning and effort. The Anniversary Committee has already spent much time and effort mulling over how to mark this occasion. After a long gestation period of planning, we will begin to see their efforts start to bear fruit. Celebrating our past and planning for the future is a great opportunity to allow the Spirit to lead us forward. We will be kicking off the prelude to this celebration soon, hopefully by September of this year. Let us place this effort, and all our efforts, in the hands of God through our prayers.

One of the major concerns derived from the census of 2005 was “lack of communication.” In order to give parishioners an opportunity to be informed about activities in the parish, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) planned and held the first Town Hall Meeting on November 29, 2006. According to the feedback received, it was a grand success. Because of the interest shown by those in attendance, it was decided to have two such meetings each year, so a second one was held on April 25, 2007 in Father Quinn Hall. Father Frank opened the meeting with a prayer and introduced the moderator of the meeting, Sister Mary Traupman, Esq., a Sister of Divine Providence and an Attorney at Law. The date of the Fall Parish Town Hall Meeting will be Wednesday, **October 24, 2007 at 7:00 pm in Father Quinn Hall**. All parishioners are encouraged to attend.

The PPC has established a committee to publish our newsletter twice a year, once in January and once in July. Together with the Town Hall Meetings, parishioners will have four opportunities each year to learn about the activities and ministries in the parish. Hopefully, this will be both informative and helpful to our members.

In the summer of 2006, using the same census responses, members of the PPC selected the five most pressing issues identified by parishioners and used these issues as the bases for long-range planning. The goals are:

1. To spread the message of the Gospel through increased opportunities for adult education and to create two lay-directed committees
2. To begin a stewardship campaign that will guide parishioners in the best use of their time and talents
3. To encourage inactive members of the parish to return to full participatory membership
4. To challenge members of the parish to witness to the Christian life of the Scriptures
5. To foster a spirit of community in the parish

Each member of the council has volunteered to establish and work with a committee that would study these goals and develop objectives that would see them to fruition during the next three years. During 2007, the council will concentrate on the first two goals listed above. Automatic External Cardiac Defibrillator (AED)

Dear Concerned Parishioner:

Thank you for sharing your thoughts as input is always welcomed from the parishioners. Let me first of all offer clarification and insight into the primary purpose of a Youth Group. A Youth Group, first and foremost, serves as a means whereby the youth of the parish can come together for both spiritual development and social interaction. This activity within a Christian/Catholic context allows for both development in the faith along with social and interpersonal interaction. Therefore, to focus entirely on social aspects void of any spiritual development would make the Youth Group no different than say a Boy's or Girl's Club. Therefore if it is only social interaction that is desired then the latter alternatives by all means should be pursued: but if both spiritual and social development is the goal then a Youth Group in its truest form is the preferred approach. With this in mind, an integral component of the program will be to have a trained and experienced leader in place. Thank you again for sharing your thoughts.

The Stewardship Initiative began with Advent 2006 when a series of six meditations on how to discover one's gifts/talents were included in the weekly bulletins for six weeks. These meditations were intended to help members of the parish discover the talents they may possess which could be used in the service of the church community. To keep the idea of stewardship before the minds of parishioners, one-sentence talking points on stewardship are being included in each Sunday bulletin throughout this year.

During Lent, another series of bulletin inserts were provided to members of the parish to help them see stewardship as an aspect of discipleship and to help them understand the meaning of stewardship conversion. Parishioners were encouraged to discern where the Spirit is calling them and to give of their time and talent to one of the existing parish ministries.

Brainstorming sessions led the stewardship team to identify areas where stewardship activities might begin to meet parish and community needs. These activities include: meeting with representatives of the various church ministries in order to learn which stewardship endeavors are already a part of parish ministry; organizing a team to publish a regular bi-annual parish newsletter; forming an experimental small faith community; developing a team to help the homeless; and publishing a parish directory.

The stewardship team exists to educate our parish community in the Biblical application of whole life stewardship. It is composed of people who are passionate about growing spirituality and extending mission, i.e., encouraging the People of God to reflect God's generous character. Stewards are people who "walk the walk." "Talking the talk" is not enough for them.

TRANSITIONS FOR LAY ECCLESIAL MINISTERS OF OUR PARISH



The Church now recognizes lay people who are in service to the Church as Lay Ecclesial Ministers. A letter by our bishops titled, *Workers in the Vineyard*, addresses this level of ministry as vital to the life of the Church. You can access this document on USCCB Website for more information. We note here two of our Lay Ecclesial Ministers at Resurrection.

As of July 1, 2007, Bernice Dumitru, who was our Director of Faith Formation for the past ten years, will be retiring from the management of the children's program and moving into other areas of ministry in the parish on a part-time basis. She will continue with the RCIA Program but will be focusing on ministry to the sick, the elderly and the homebound of the parish, as well as assisting the Bereavement Group, The Ladies of Charity and the St. Vincent de Paul Society with their ministry to the grieving and the poor. This is not a new ministry for Bernice; she was a chaplain at Ohio Valley General Hospital for twelve years and was involved in these areas on a very limited basis when she first came to Resurrection.

Mary Diskin, who managed the CCD Program for five months on an interim basis before Bernice took over in August of 1997, will become the Coordinator of Faith Formation. Mary has been a catechist for over twelve years and in the past year has acted as assistant to Bernice. She is well qualified and enthusiastic about assuming this new role.

We wish both Mary and Bernice God's blessings in their new positions of ministry to the Church of the Resurrection.
